## Section 4. First aid measures

### **Description of necessary first aid measures**

**Eye contact**

Specific hazards arising from the chemical

: Combustible liquid. In a fire or if heated, a pressure increase will occur and the container may burst, with the risk of a subsequent explosion. Runoff to sewer may create fire or explosion hazard. ## Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

**Small spill**

## Section 7. Handling and storage

#### **Precautions for safe handling**

**Protective measures** 

: Put on appropriate personal protective equipment (see Section 8). Avoid exposure obtain special instructions before use. Avoid exposure during pregnancy. # Appropriate engineering controls

: Use only with adequate ventilation.
